Houston area teacher named Secondary Educator of the Year

AUSTIN – Andrea Barnes, a middle school teacher in the Cypress-Fairbanks Independent School District, was recently honored as the Secondary Educator of the Year by the Association of Texas Professional Educators (ATPE). The 23-year education veteran was presented with this honor and a \$1,000 check during the 2012 ATPE Summit Awards Banquet July 16 at the Austin Convention Center.

Barnes teaches seventh and eighth grade students at Aragon Middle School. She was one of three finalists for the award. Rose Perez, an instructional teacher advisor in the Corpus Christi Independent School District, and Gertrude Byers, a sophomore English teacher in the Birdville Independent School District, were the other finalists.

Nearly 800 people celebrated the achievements of public school educators at the banquet where awards were presented to educators in administrator, associate, elementary and secondary teacher, and special services categories.

Attendees at the ATPE Summit, the association's annual education conference, also had the opportunity to attend professional development sessions, hear from renowned educators, participate in the organization's annual governance meeting, the ATPE House of Delegates, and elect new state officers for 2012-13.
